### Consultation of Bloomberg Database

During Phase 2.2, the Bloomberg room will be open to users having filled in and signed the [form](#) giving permission to access the consultation rooms, as follows:

- researchers and professors - the form does not need to be signed;
- BA thesis students - only with the approval of the supervisor and after signing the form;
- MA thesis students - after signing the form;
- Phd students, Research fellows and post doc, tutors and lecturers - after signing the form.

The user, before accessing the library, must give the librarian the form filled and subscribed. He will also have to sign a special register, kept by the Library.

Access to the Bloomberg Room will be possible:

- Monday to Thursday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM, Friday 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM;
- only by reservation through the calendar (use this [link](#)).

Consultation of the database is allowed only one person at a time; between one user and another the premises will be aerated for at least 15 minutes, the worktop and the computer will be treated with sanitizing substances.

The user, before accessing the Bloomberg consultation room, must deposit backpacks and/ or bags in the appropriate lockers.

### Bloomberg Markets Concepts Course

#### Course description

It is possible to attend the BMC in the room where Bloomberg terminal is located. Course reservation is on line using the credentials you were assigned to check institutional email (use this [link](#)).

Attending the BMC is possible Monday to Thursday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM, Friday 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM.

Bloomberg Market Concept is a self-paced e-learning course by Bloomberg that can be completed within a week and the participants are awarded with a certificate of COMPLETION at the end of the course. (The final certificate will not report the score gained).

This course primarily includes 8 hours of video tutorials which utilize Bloomberg data, indices, analytics and news stories to provide knowledge of market essentials to the participants.

The course material is divided into 4 modules dedicated to specific market sectors (Economic Indicators, Currencies, Fixed Income, Equities) and participants are presented with 120 assessment questions throughout the modules.

Each of these modules consists of several sub-modules and the participants are expected to acquire knowledge of at least one sub-module per sitting.

This course also aims at introducing participants to the Bloomberg Terminal which is commonly employed by financial services firms. Along with the course contents, participants would be introduced to new Bloomberg Terminal functions at every step which can help retrieve, display, read and interpret data on the terminal. It offers a kind of limited practical exposure to Bloomberg Terminal which can come in handy later.

It is strongly recommended not to take the course lightly and devote enough time to go through the contents and master them to be able to take full advantage in terms of acquiring useful knowledge, skills and capabilities.
